Reading

OUR LEARNING

<p>English</p> 	<p>We will be incorporating drama in our English lessons once again. We will be using fiction texts in order to have a particular focus on story writing and imaginative language. Throughout English we will also be using our reading skills like making predictions and sequencing.</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>In Maths this term we will begin with multiplication and division, looking at groups, sharing and arrays. We will then move onto fractions, looking at fractions of whole numbers and shapes.</p>
<p>Science</p> 	<p>In Science we will begin by learning all about plants and germination. We will be doing lots of practical investigations to help us with our understanding. We will then move onto animals including humans; thinking about the basic needs of these.</p>
<p>Computing</p> 	<p>We will be learning about how to use computers and the internet safely and respectfully. We will recognise the common use of technology that is google maps to aid us. We will also learn about algorithms and directions.</p>

ENRICHMENT AREAS OF LEARNING

<p>History and Geography</p> 	<p>During our topic lessons we will be identifying changes in houses over time and comparing different house types. We will be focusing on our local area and what it has and comparing this to a town or village. We will use maps to help us give and follow directions including drawing a familiar route.</p>
<p>RE</p> 	<p>In RE we will be learning about Sikhism. We will learn all about Anad Karaj which is the celebration that takes place before a sikh wedding. We will learn about all of the traditions and be able to explain why they are important.</p>
<p>Art</p> 	<p>In Art we will be looking at the artist Laurence Stephen Lowry. We will using his style of matchstick men and urban landscape paintings to develop our own version of his well-known paintings.</p>
<p>P.E.</p> 	<p>This term the children will be taking part in PE on a Wednesday and Friday. During these sessions they will be practicing and learning a range of athletic events. These sessions will take place outside where possible.</p>
