

## CLASS NOTICES

### Reading

All children will read for at least 10 minutes every day in school and we advise parents/guardians to listen to your child read at home for **10 minutes a day, at least 5 days a week**. They will also be heard read by an adult at least once a week. Please ensure your child is reading a book appropriate for their level.

### PE

PE will take place on **Wednesdays and Fridays**.

Children need to come to school in their PE Uniform:

***black shorts or jogging trousers, plain, white t-shirt, plain black/dark jumper or hoodie and black trainers or plimsolls. No football kits or brightly coloured clothing.***

They will also need their coat for playtime and lunchtimes when they are outside. Children wearing earrings in will not be allowed to take part in the session.

## ENRICHMENT AREAS OF LEARNING

<p><b>English</b></p> 	<p>In English, we will be reading <i>Carnival of the Lost</i> by Kieran Larwood. As well as enjoying this story, we will be writing setting descriptions about Victorian London and non-chronological reports about famous Victorian inventors/inventions/Great Exhibition.</p>
<p><b>Maths</b></p> 	<p>In Maths, we will be focusing on Place Value, understanding the value of each digit within a number and how to partition large scale numbers, as well as comparing and ordering them. There will also be a focus on rounding numbers.</p>
<p><b>Science</b></p> 	<p>In Science, we are going to learn about electricity. We will be associating the brightness of a lamp with the number and voltage of cells. The children will also learn to recognise symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram.</p>
<p><b>Computing</b></p> 	<p>In computing, we will be learning how to stay safe on the internet with e-safety. Children will be learning how to search the web and understand how searches are influenced.</p>
<p><b>R.E.</b></p> 	<p>Key Question in RE will be: What matters most to Christians and Humanists? Children will investigate different religious (Christianity) and non-religious (Humanists) groups about their way of life. Pupils will begin to understand that not all people are religious and they will begin to build up an understanding of the concepts of justice, fairness and forgiveness.</p>

## ENRICHMENT AREAS OF LEARNING

<p><b>Geography and History</b></p> 	<p>In History, we will be learning about time in the Victorian era. Children will begin to understand how the Victorians revolutionised living, which has influenced the modern day. Children will be learning about significant individuals such as Queen Victoria. In Geography, children will be learning about human and physical geographical features and how they bring spatial variation over time.</p>
<p><b>MUSIC</b></p> 	<p>In Music, we will be listening to the song 'Happy' by Pharrell Williams. The music genre of this piece is 'Pop'. Children will be learning how to listen and appraise this style of music, describing structure and musical dimensions and identifying different instruments. Children will be playing instruments, improvising and composing a melody.</p>
<p><b>DT/Art</b></p> 	<p>Children will be learning about a famous Victorian Artist in Art, named William Morris. Children will be using William Morris' technique of printing to print their own designs. In D&amp;T, children will be designing and creating Victorian homecraft - structures.</p>
<p><b>P.E.</b></p> 	<p>Year 6 will be having a Sports Coach in to teach every Wednesday for Tag Rugby and Netball on Friday. This term we will be looking at how to pass, receive and travel with the ball as well as tackle and shoot.</p>
<p><b>MFL</b></p> 	<p>Year 6 will be continuing our MFL journey with Spanish. We will still look at the zoo and shapes as well as recapping previous learning.</p>
