LEARNING IN EYFS CHINESE NEW YEAR







In EYFS this half term we have learnt about the celebrations that take place around Chinese New Year. The children have enjoyed learning all about the history through the story 'The Great Race' and they have also made lanterns, tasted some Chinese food, painted Chinese numerals and performed a dragon dance for their friends.

YEAR 5 - KATHERINE OF ARAGON AT PETERBOROUGH CATHEDRAL



Year 5 were lucky enough to have been invited to Peterborough Cathedral to take part in the Katherine of Aragon festival. We had a fantastic day where we made a Tudor game, practised our sowing, crushed charcoal to make ink and wrote our names using it with a feather pen! We also met Katherine of Aragon and learnt about her life, practised our Tudor dancing and learnt about Tudor food, weapons and medicine. We had a fantastic day and learnt a lot.





YEAR 1 AND 2 - WILD SCIENCE

This half term Isabelle from Wild Science came to visit Year 1 and 2. She brought some animals with her to help us learn more about habitats and micro habitats. We met Malcolm the leopard gecko who lives in deserts and is nocturnal. We discovered that he needs somewhere cool to rest in the day and prefers to catch food at night when he is safer from predators. We also discovered that his tiny claws tickle! Gertrude the tree frog was happy to sit in our hands. We learned that she can change colour and loves to live in trees, where she can find pools of water which she soaks up through her skin. We met Marvin the giant land snail and Milo the millepede who both live in a jungle habitat and each have their own way of adapting to their hot humid habitat.

It was exciting to meet the animals and we are looking forward to finding out more about animals and their habitats.



Please only request leave of absence in exceptional circumstances (not for holidays) and do so in advance.
Please book any medical appointments around the school day where possible.
