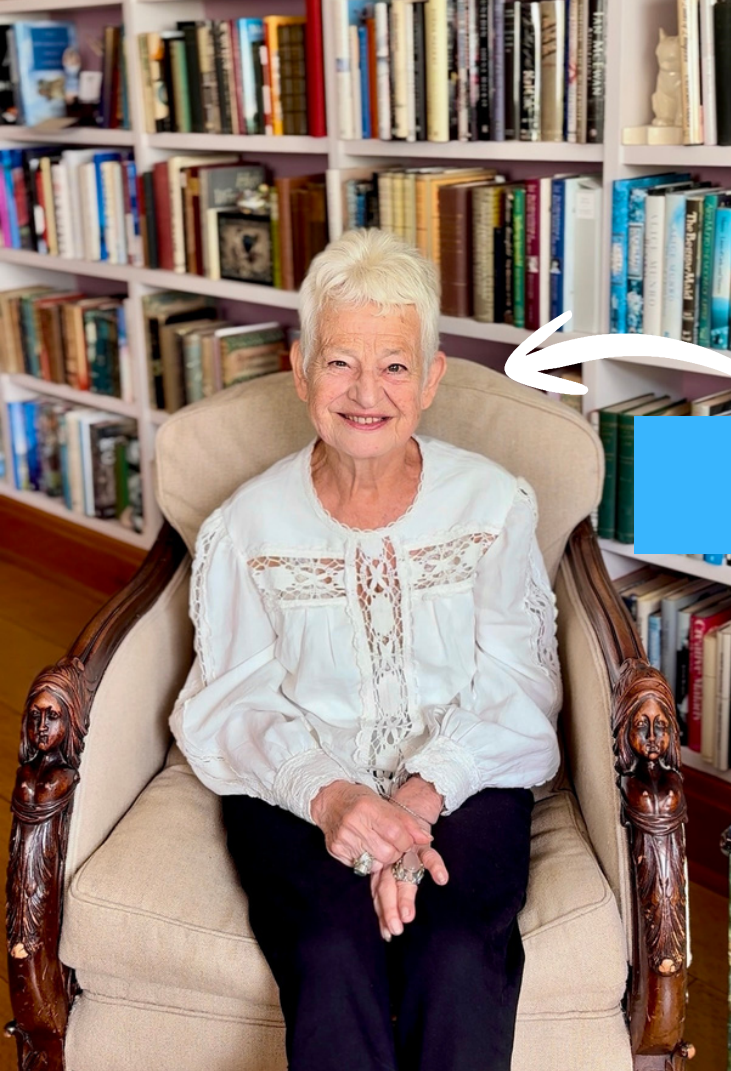

Q&A

WITH JACQUELINE WILSON

Jacqueline Wilson wrote her first novel when she was nine years old, and she has been writing ever since. She is now one of Britain's bestselling and most beloved children's authors. She has written over 100 books and is the creator of characters such as Tracy Beaker and Hetty Feather. Jacqueline is a great reader, and has amassed over 20,000 books, along with her famous collection of silver rings!

Q

What inspired you to write *ESME PEPPER*?

I'll give you a really weird answer: garden gnomes! I've always been fascinated by the way some people display them in their gardens, making them peep out from behind bushes, perch on a step, even fish from a little pond, as if they were real. I imagined an elderly man collecting his gnomes and pottering with them in his front garden, almost as if he were playing with them. I wondered what would happen if a small fierce streetwise child came into his life. How would they get on? Perhaps she could be a foster child, bitterly resenting being taken into care? But though she could be difficult, she'd also have a vivid imagination and be fascinated by the gnomes. And then what might happen?

Is Esme similar to Tracy Beaker in any way?

Esme is even fiercer than Tracy – but in a different sort of way. She's wily and tough and is very good at getting her own way, but inside she's vulnerable and missing her mum terribly. She's not afraid to take on the biggest scariest boy at her new school, but she also wants to play with her new friends and be one of the gang.

Q

How long did it take you to write the book?

I think it took me four or five months to write *Esme Pepper*'s story. I thought about her for a while when I was finishing another story, and then I wrote about her quickly with great enthusiasm. It was great fun pretending to be such a spirited child and seeing what she'd get up to next.

I had a feeling she'd only make the situation worse. Mum had a habit of falling out with people. Never me though. She's the best mum in the whole world to me. That was why I was so desperate to get out of school today. She'd promised she was getting me a big surprise – and I was pretty sure what it was going to be!

I was fizzy in my head with excitement, wanting to jump up and down, but I knew that would irritate Mrs Parsons even more. In fact, she might just keep me in all by myself out of spite. So I said in my head, 'Calm down, Esme!' and I managed to sit down meekly on my chair and murmur, 'Sorry, Mrs Parsons.'

I think it annoyed her even more that I was doing as I was told because now she had no reason to keep telling me off. She

waited several beats, her chin up hopefully for further signs of protest, but I stayed sitting where I was, though my legs were so fidgety I had to rock the chair a little bit.

Disaster! The chair collapsed under me, I fell to the floor, yelling a very rude word indeed, and the whole class roared with laughter. Mrs Parsons treated me as if I'd done it on purpose and was very, very angry. You know, purple face, spittle coming out of her mouth, hands clenched. I bet she wanted to unclench them and go smack-smack-smack but teachers aren't allowed to do that. Mum said she used to get whacked quite a lot when she was at school, but that might just be one of her stories.
